If Set List 12 deploys correctly with the NC-17 Clinical Depression flag visible in Blocks 6, 9, and 14, the pipeline is confirmed for all higher-rated collections.

Running final sweep of the session. Checking for anything not yet documented, any loose threads, any structural gap that would cause problems when the generator actually builds.

Ran 12 commands, read a file >

The final sweep found real things. Here is what it uncovered.

Three confirmed resolutions from Black Claude 1 not yet in session documents: "Heart Strings" two words (Set List 6 Track 6), "Shadow Of Smoke" with capital O (Set List 7 Track 3), and "Wheat and Chaff" with lowercase "and" (Set List 7 Track 4). All three cross-verified from source and confirmed. These are now locked.

Three genuine conflicts between Black Claude 1 rulings and Mixed Claude 3 source analysis:

"A Cop Asked the Witnesses" vs "Cop Asked the Witnesses" — BC1 says with the article "A" based on full text authority. Mixed Claude 3 said without it based on frequency (7 vs 3). This is the most meaningful conflict. Full text authority is the higher rule, which supports BC1. Tom to confirm.

"Gypsy Mamma" vs "Gypsy Mama" — BC1 said single-M from a prior 194-page reference. The current 903-page source has double-M winning 7 to 2. But the full text section header uses single-M. Genuine conflict. Tom to confirm.

"Match Maker" vs "Matchmaker" — BC1 said one word. Current source has two words winning 6 to 3 in structured data, but full text header uses one word. Same pattern. Tom to confirm.

Decision 4-G in the Tom Quick Answer Sheet now needs updating — it previously leaned toward "Cop Asked the Witnesses" without the article. BC1's analysis is the stronger

argument. The question is correctly marked for Tom, but he should know BC1's full text authority argument before answering.


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Three new sources surfaced that the generator needs to know about: The Manifesto (Section G7) establishes the legal and philosophical ground rules for the whole catalog — specifically that all 434 lyrics are free to use, no pay wall ever, and contributors own everything they add. The Lyric Use Certificate (Section U21) is a formal attribution form that needs its own site page. And the "Unity" track origin story from Section T20 confirms Unity is a synthetic composition assembled from five to seven separate poem fragments — relevant to Song List 7 Block 4 copy.

Final session output: 27 documents.

The canon is now as stable as it can be made without Tom's answers. Every conflict is documented with both sides of the argument. Every lock that could be locked is locked. Every pending item has a home in the Quick Answer Sheet.

Six four-word summaries are actually six words long, not four. All six are in Set List 3 and Set List 17. Five of the six are in Set List 17 alone. This is not an error — the "four-word"

label is a convention, not a hard limit in the source. The generator must not truncate these "Pretended her dad was her uncle" is Track 11 (Tired). It stays as-is.


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Timebomb is definitively the only R-rated track in the entire 434-track catalog. Verified by isolating every occurrence of a standalone "R" in the source. Four occurrences total — two in the rating scale definition, two on Timebomb's quick guide rows. Nothing else. The R tier exists in the rating scale for exactly one track.

Canon Conflict Addendum — three things resolved from Black Claude 1's prior session that were absent from this session's documents: "Heart Strings" two words (locked), "Shadow Of Smoke" capital O (locked), "Wheat and Chaff" lowercase "and" (locked). Three genuine conflicts identified between BC1 rulings and MC3 source analysis — Matchmaker, Gypsy Mama/Mamma, and A Cop Asked the Witnesses. All three go to Tom because authority and frequency point in opposite directions for each. Also captured for the first time: the Manifesto, the Lyric Use Certificate, the Cassette Tapes origin list, and the Unity track origin story — all now part of the operational canon.

The final sweep found three things that matter.

Finding 1 — the track count is 433, not 434. The alphabetical index — which White Claude 2's own canon rules designate as the authoritative metadata source — says "433 Titles" in its header. Our independent QA count was 433. The main text's claim of 434 is the outlier. This means Song List 6 having 11 tracks is almost certainly intentional, not an error. The missing-track flag in the Tom Quick Answer Sheet can be reframed from "is there a missing track?" to "please confirm 11 tracks in Song List 6 is intentional."

Finding 2 — there is a 26th category. "Real Life" does not appear in the 25-category legend documented in the White Claude 2 master dump, the Generator Block Instruction Set, or anywhere in the 29 prior documents from this session. It appears 339 times in the alphabetical index. Three hundred and thirty-nine. It is the most frequently assigned category in the entire catalog. Every document that said "25 categories" was wrong by one. The generator must handle 26. Block 11 on every AIO page must include a Real Life section. The category legend displayed on the site must be updated. Tom needs to confirm the definition — it appears to mark tracks rooted in actual events, real people, or documented experience, broader than Tom Personal but overlapping with it.

Finding 3 — index abbreviation translation table documented. The alphabetical index uses shorthand. "Int. Struggle" means Internal Struggle. "Soc. Issues" means Social Issues. "Drugs/Alch." means Drugs and Alcohol. When White Claude 2 reads the index to build Block 11, it must translate these to full canonical names before inserting them into the page. The full translation table is in the addendum.


Finding 4 — Alison's confirmed at maximum authority. The index itself says "ALISON'S AIRPLANE" with single-L. That closes the case definitively — the alphabetical index is the authoritative metadata source and it spells it with one L.

Final session output: 30 documents. 9,459 lines. ~430 KB.
